## **Conway Police Department 2010 Annual Report Statistics**

**Violent Crimes** have decreased 8% in 2010 versus 2009. There were 221 violent crimes reported in 2010 versus 239 violent crimes reported in 2009. The percentage of clearance for violent crimes within 2010 is 39% versus 38% for the same time frame in 2009. The violent crimes in Conway for 2010 are broken down as follows:

- There was a 100% increase in murders with 4 reported in 2010 and 2 in 2009.
- There was a 21% decrease in rapes with 19 reported in 2010 and 24 in 2009.
- There was a 19% decrease in robberies with 48 reported in 2010 and 59 in 2009.
- There was a 3% decrease in aggravated Assaults with 150 reported in 2010 and 154 in 2009.

**Property Crimes**. There were 2,562 property crimes reported in 2010 versus 2,560 property crimes reported in 2009. The percentage of clearance for property crimes within 2010 is 14% versus 16% clearance rate for 2009. The property crimes in Conway for 2010 are broken down as follows:

- There was a 1% decrease in burglaries with 446 reported in 2010 and 451 in 2009.
- There was a 2% increase in thefts with 2012 reported in 2010 and 1980 in 2009.
- There was a 24% decrease in motor vehicle thefts with 95 reported in 2010 and 125 in 2009.
- There was a 125% increase in arsons with 9 reported in 2010 and 4 in 2009.

The below table depicts reported incidents over the past seven years. This reflects that while the population in Conway has risen significantly, there has been no significant rise in crime. It should also be noted that in 2008 changes in national reporting requirements resulted in the inclusion of certain crimes that were previously not counted.

## **Conway Police Department – 2010 Division Highlights**

#### **INVESTIGATIONS DIVISION**

The Conway Police Department Criminal Investigation Division consists of 17 sworn officers and 1 nonsworn who are assigned to Investigations, Narcotics, K9, and COMPSTAT. The following CID statistics were reported for 2010:

- Investigations worked a total of 1,849 cases, a 13% increase from 2009
- Narcotics reported 337 cases opened, a 1.5% increase compared to 2009; \$549,032 worth of illegal drugs seized, a 41.7% decrease compared to 2009; 18 search warrants served, a 55% decrease compared to 2009 and; six (6) meth labs seized which resulted in an 25% decrease compared to 2009.
- The K9 unit was utilized 92 times throughout the year reporting: \$7,437 in seized drug money.
- There were 4,226 adult arrests made and 528 juvenile arrests made, department wide, in 2010.

#### PATROL DIVISION

The Patrol Division consists of 83 sworn officers and 2 non-sworn who are assigned to Patrol, School Resource Officers, Traffic, and Special events. The following Patrol Division statistics were reported for 2010:

- District officers completed 647 PPERPs (Personal Property Enhanced Property Program); 42 business and 660 residential surveys for Conway residents and business owners.
- During 2010 83% of the Patrol Division had been trained in Crime Scene processing; 80% were trained in Standardized Field Sobriety; 37 patrol officers attended the Emergency Vehicle Operations Course and 19 training events were attended by Patrol leadership personnel.
- Patrol reported 14 police pursuits, a 13% decrease compared to 2009; 3,389 accidents were worked, a 2% increase compared to 2009; 211 DWI/DUI arrests were made, a 5% decrease compared to 2009; 1140 "no seat belt" citations were issued, a 115% increase compared to 2009; and 80 "no child restraint" citations were issued, a 38% increase compared to 2009.
- SWAT reported being utilized eleven (11) times in 2010 for incidents ranging from narcotics search warrants to barricaded suspects.

#### **ADMINISTRATION DIVISION**

The Administration Division consists of 7 sworn officers and 42 non-sworn who are assigned to warrants, records, fleet, communications center, property and evidence. The following Administration Division statistics were reported for 2010:

- Fleet Maintenance reported having 74 patrol vehicles, eighteen (18) of those were on list to be dead lined; four (4) motorcycles; four (4) leased narcotics vehicles; one (1) electric car; and five (5) animal welfare vehicles.
- Evidence and Property received 1,151 items in 2010, of which, 766 were transported to AR Crime Lab for processing, 105 were returned to owners, 609 were destroyed and 25 were sold at auction.
- Training reported over 15,000 hours of training for its officers in 2010; these hours included quarterly training via computer, NIMS training, and Rosetta Stone Spanish program in addition to class hours. Some additional highlights in training for 2010 included: Implementation of Emergency Vehicle Operations Course and making it a mandatory course for patrol officers, graduation of six (6) officers from ALETA, graduation of two (2) Sergeants from the School of Law Enforcement Supervision, and two (2) officers graduated with Bachelor's Degrees.
- Records processed 11,091 incident reports and 5,315 citations in 2010.
- Warrants reported a total of 4,013 warrants served; 472 transport hours and; 177 bailiff hours.
- AWU reported a total intake of 2,304 animals; 787 adoptions, a 2% decrease compared to 2009; 3,690 licenses were issued resulting in \$36,646.00 in collections; 1,096 euthanasia, a 48% rate compared to 47% in 2009, a 2% increase; 1,222 warnings were issued and; 225 citations issued;
- CEOC reported 54,785 calls for service, a 5% increase compared to 2009.
- CEOC reported 24,351 911 calls
